VOTING OPTIONS

Vote by Absentee Ballot – now until October 29

- ✓ Verify registration and request an early ballot at myvote.wi.gov OR in person at your local clerk's office to avoid needing to register at the polls on November 3rd.
- ✓ Return your ballot by...

- mailing it before October 27th (sooner is better!). Remember to have your witness write their address on the ballot! In the April election, some ballots were rejected because they didn't have the witness's address on the envelope.

Plover Post Office officials will be sorting out ballots returned through Plover mail and deliver them directly to village of Plover officials without sending them out of the village.

- using a secure drop box

Stevens Point boxes are located at the Strongs Avenue entrance to City Hall or at UWSP in front of the Dreyfus University Center

Town of Hull box is located at 4550 Wojcik Memorial Drive (address of clerk's office)

Officials empty the drop boxes several times a day and all returned ballots are stored in a fireproof, locked safe. Ballots are delivered to election officials in each jurisdiction on Election Day and are processed with all the other ballots.

- hand delivering your ballot to your local clerk's office
- ✓ Check that your ballot has been received at myvote.wi.gov
